



Code of ethics for the coach

The coach must first of all be aware of the importance of its role and the influence it has on athletes and his entourage. It must assume a mission education and physical, moral and social training of athletes and be worthy of this responsibility. It must make further efforts to the well-being and interests of its athletes to their forms, victories and defeats. It should not consider combat sports as an end in itself, but as an educational tool. In order to accomplish its task successfully, the coach must:

- 1^e know, respect and apply the security regulations applicable to its discipline of combat ;**
- 2^e respect the decisions of officials, support these at any time and require a similar behavior of its athletes;**
- 3^e raise its athletes to sportsmanship, encourage and reward such behavior;**
- 4^e de-dramatize the defeat considering the victory only as one of the pleasures of combat and convey this concept with its athletes.**
- 5^e do not forget that less talented athletes deserve and need to fight just as much as the others.**
- 6^e meet the coaches, opposing athletes and their supporters and require the same behavior of its athletes;**
- 7^e learn to athletes that regulations are intended to protect and establish standards to determine a winner and a loser.**
- 8^e have reasonable demands on athletes for what is the time and energy required for training, competition and other activities;**
- 9 always to remember that the purpose of combat sports full contact amateur is not to put the opponent KO or attempting to injure by methods permitted or prohibited;**
- 10^e avoid intake of alcoholic beverages or drugs before its athletes and raise awareness of the problems associated with the consumption of these products as well as doping in sport.**
